

## **NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018**

- Miscellaneous items increased by 6%, plastics by 5%, rubber by 2% and glass by 1%
- Paper decreased is presence by 6%, polystyrene by 5%, metals by 2% and wood by 1%

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#### **NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018**

#### Within grouped data:

- Non-food packaging items nearly doubled to 32.6%, toys, sporting equipment, ropes & straps increased by 1.3%, beverage containers by 1%, and plastic bags by 0.3%
- Decreases were recorded in counts of food packaging [-11.6%], chip & confectionery wrappers [-5.7%], construction materials [-0.3%] and beverage related rubbish [-0.2%],
- Illegally dumped household goods and clothing replaced nonidentifiable and sanitary items within the grouped Top 10.

#### Within Individual item counts:

- Cigarette butt counts increased by 6.5% from 2018
- $\bullet$  Plastic packaging rose by 0.5% and plastic bottle caps & lids by 0.1%
- Decreased counts were recorded for small pieces of paper [-1.5], foil confectionery wrappers [-0.3] and alcoholic beverage bottles [-0.1]
- Additions to the 2019 list were other plastics, garbage/rubbish bags, straws and alcohol cans – replacing pieces of polystyrene, plastic chip & confectionery wrappers, metal bottle caps and napkins & tissues.

## **FAVOURITE CLEAN UP SITES**

Parks and School Grounds were the most popular sites surveyed in 2019. Beach/coastal areas recorded the highest average rubbish counts.

#### **NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018**

# All sites except shops/mall reported increased average item counts in 2019:

- Roadway average counts nearly trebled to 446 [152 last year]
- Beach coastal areas increased by a third to 600 [431 in 2018]
- River/creeks counts increased by 123
- Parks rose by 98
- Other [mixed locations] increased average counts of 32
- School Grounds reported a more modest growth of 22

Shops/Malls reported a decrease of 174 in 2019 [287 in 2018].

We received one survey from an Outdoor Transport area site, from which 337 items were removed.
